ASSEMBLY OF CROSS-BARS

COMPONENTS:

1. Ensure the roof is clean, free from dust and grease.

NCHOR POIN

2. Insert the neck of the End-Support into the void of the Cross-bar profile. They are designed to be a tight fit: use a rubber mallet if necessary (Fig.1)

3. Pull back the rubber Buffer Strip about 20mm until the screw hole can be accessed.(Fig. 2) Using a Phillips Head Screwdriver, fasten the screw through the cross-bar and into the End Support.


Do this for all four sides and replace the buffer strip.


NOTE: The longer cross-bars are to be fitted to the front of the vehicle. Check labelling on the underside of the cross-bar.


FITTING CROSS-BARS TO VEHICLE


- 4. On the vehilce roof you will found 4 anchor point covers. Carefully remove these covers by hinging open using a small cloth covered screw driver (NOTE: Take care not to scratch the paintwork) to expose the anchor points. It is advisable to screw the special bolts into the anchor point at this time to clean the threads (Fig.4a).
- 5. Place the mounting straps over the anchor points. Larger mounting strap fits to the rear and the smaller strap fits to the front. NOTE: Mounting strap configuration may vary, cage nut hole must always be positioned to the rear of the vehicle. (Fig.4b)
- 6. Fit the short M6 \times 16mm bolts through the mounting straps and into the anchoring points, tighten with the security key provided.
- 7. Place the rubber pads over the mounting straps with the pointier end facing towards the front of the vehicle (Fig.5). (The rubber pad with the larger curve on the under side, fits to the rear position of the vehicle)/
- 8. Place the appropriate crossbar assembly onto the rubber pads. NOTE: The longer crossbar is fitted to the front of the vehicle.
- 9. Loosely fit the longer M6 x 45mm special bolt through the end support and bolt cover then into the anchor point. Give two to three turns of the special bolt in thanchor point with the security key provided. Go to the other side of the vehicle and pull on the end support and fit the same. This will allow correct alignment of ancor point and special bolt threads (Fig.5).
- 10. Proceed to follow steps 5 to 8 when mounting the Rear Cross-bar Assy.
- 11. You are now ready to mount your "Accessories" set onto the cross-bars using the Global Mount Channel. Once installed, insert the 'Global Channel' Covers into the End Supports.


Note: You have a choice of 2 - (a) quick access snap-on cover or (b) long term mounting - security cover to cap off and lock the mount channel. (Fig. 6)











General Usage Information

It is essential for the proper assembly, operation and use of the Roof Rack that the instructions and safety precautions supplied are strictly observed. Read any fitting, care and usage instruction carefully.

The maximum permissible load for your Roof Bar is the lower of the maximum load capacity specified in your vehicle operation manual, or specified as applying to the Roof-Rack. Do not exceed the maximum specified load capacity.

Maximum permissible load = weight of the Roof Rack + weight of accessories + weight of load (cargo).

When fitting the Roof-Rack and transporting a load, ensure the vehicle's functions are not impaired (eg, sunroof, aerials, windscreen wipers, mirrors). Rear doors on Hatch- and Wagon-type vehicles should be inspected for adequate clearance for full opening operation of the boot/tailgate.

Stop and check all screw connections, bolts and retaining straps after a short distance of travel. Repeat these checks at regular intervals.

Warnings

Remember that the fitting of a Roof Rack and the transport of a load increases the overall height of the carrying vehicle.

Where the Roof-Rack is to be used in off-road conditions, a safety weight reduction of 1.5 should be observed from the total carrying capacity. (eg. 60kg becomes 40kg)
