Contents - 2x fixed, forged, tubular arms - complete with H/D ball joints.

Suggested Install Method:

Raise vehicle evenly and safely support.
 Never rely on a Jack only

- · Proceed to remove front wheels.
- Next, remove ABS sensor from the hub.
 Followed by un-bolting wire from the arm. Refer RH image.





• Next, un-bolt the brake line.

It is recommended that a licenced workshop or tradesperson carry out the above procedure and that workshop manual and relevant safety procedures are followed in addition to the above.

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• Loosen Ball Joint nut (do not remove yet).

Strike the hub/upright with a hammer to break the taper. Refer RH image.

• Now remove the nut.





 Loosen and remove the 2 inner bushing bolts.

Refer LH image.

The arm can now be removed from the vehicle.

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• It is recommended to bolt up new ball joint (with supplied nuts and bolts before installing the A arm to vehicle).

Important - place ball joint under the arm as per below image.

• Proceed to bolt up new A-Arms to vehicle using original inner nuts and bolts.

Note the A-Arms are specifically LH and RH.


- Note the ABS wire bracket configuration below. The bracket is slightly rotated from the original OE position.
- Confirm all nuts and bolts are tight.

IMPORTANT - check the mechanical droop stop (at rear of arm) is not contacting the A-Arm at full droop.

· Re-fit front wheels.

IMPORTANT - a wheel alignment will be required immediately after install.

- Road test vehicle.
- Re-check all bolts after 500km, specifically the ball joint nuts and bolts.
